
## Black Spot (Nanophyetus)

Nanophyetus salmincola is a common trematode parasite of fish in Oregon. It is known as the "salmon poisoning fluke" because it can carry the bacterium Neorickettsia helminthoeca, which can be fatal for dogs that eat uncooked, infected fish. Nanophyetus has a complex life cycle that involves a snail, fish and mammal hosts. In fish tissues it forms cysts, which appear as small black spots.





Researchers from the Kent and Bartholomew Labs (OSU Microbiology) and Schreck Lab (OSU Fisheries & Wildlife) discovered that Nanophyetus infection reduced both growth and swimming ability in Coho salmon. High infection intensity could also increase susceptibility to bacterial infections in juvenile Chinook salmon.
