

Laboratory Skills

MB 201

Course Credits: variable, from 1-16

- For each registered credit of MB 201, a student is expected to spend a minimum of thirty hours per term (e.g. 3 hours per week per credit for ten weeks).

Pre-reqs/Co-reqs: none

Course Outcomes:

- Participate in a research laboratory, learning the specific techniques used by that laboratory to address research questions.

Course Content:

- The exact tasks to be performed by the student would be determined by the mentor but could include a variety of basic laboratory tasks such as washing dishes, making up solutions, counting colonies/cells, experiment preparation, etc.

Course Policies:

- These credits are set up to recognize the more basic contributions that a student might make to a research laboratory. If the activities develop into an independent or more advanced project to be completed by the student then the student should sign up for MB 401: Research Credits.
- Be advised that the summer MB 201 credits are set up for an 8 week session spanning from mid-June to mid-August (session 3). The necessary hours may be completed anytime within that time frame, in agreement with the laboratory mentor, but the student is responsible for ensuring that an adequate amount of time is spent in the laboratory per credit of MB 201. If the necessary hours are not completed by the end of session 3 an Incomplete Grade will be entered.

Evaluation of Student Performance:

- Grading for these credits will be Pass/No Pass, with the final grade determined by the laboratory mentor.
